

SKOG PASSAGE 63 18S 56 59W

The United States Board on Geographic Names approved the Antarctic geographic name Skog Passage on April 16, 2002.

A narrow channel, 0,2 NM wide, between Madder Cliffs on the W end of Joinville Island, and an unnamed island, connecting Suspiros Bay and an unnamed body of water. Named for Captain Peter Skog who has been on cruise ships in Antarctic waters since 1974.

In 1998, as Master of the MS Explorer, Captain Skog became the first person to pilot a cruise ship through this channel that now bears his name.
